On March 19, 2020, Governor Cuomo issued Executive Order No. 202.7 which temporarily suspends through April 18, 2020 the rule requiring physical appearance before a notary public. Please do not forget about the estate planning side of your affairs. It is incredibly important, now more than ever, to make sure your health care proxies and powers of attorney are in order.
