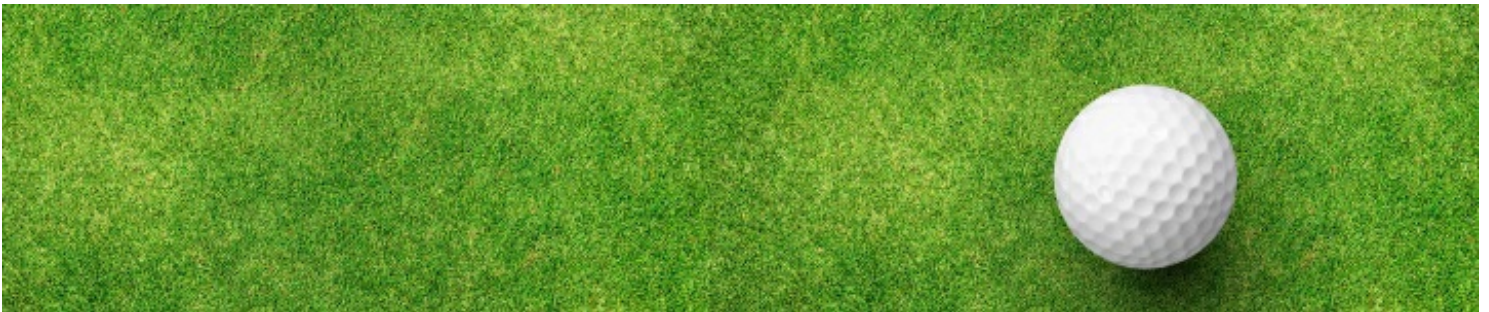


Supporting Local Giving Back Initiatives

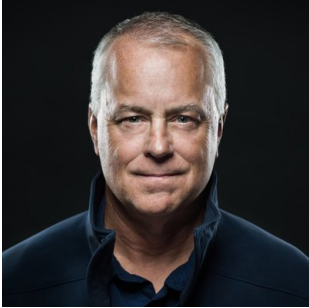
